About the TSN

The Tsunami Support Network is being coordinated by the British Red Cross which is working closely with the Foreign & Commonwealth Office (FCO) & the Dept for Culture, Media & Sport (DCMS). The DCMS is coordinating aftercare for those affected by the Tsunami.

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Second Tsunami Support Group Meeting

A second full meeting of the Support Group is 17th: Saturday September planned for invitations are being issued. This will provide a further opportunity for people directly affected by the Disaster to meet each other. A number of people who were unable to accept our invitation in May have expressed an interest in attending this. There will also be an opportunity to discuss the Support Group committee as well as meet members of the National Audit Office Review Team (see page 5 for more details). More information will also be available about the autumn programme of events we are organising.

Support Group Committee

A number of people have expressed an interest in being on the main Support Group committee which we are helping to set up. At the moment the Network helps to organise and arrange activities of the Support Group. Eventually our aim at the Network is to hand over the administration and decision-making activities of the Support Group to its own committee. There are examples of how such groups and committee have been structured following past disasters, but each one tends to differ and we are keen that everyone affected by the tsunami should have a say in how the Tsunami Support Group committee should be set up and run.

In order to start this process, we would like to help identify those individuals who may be interested in being part of a committee and circulate their details to all on the Network. At the meeting on September 17 we will invite discussions about taking this forward and forming an official committee.

The sorts of roles and skills that would be helpful to have on the committee include: coordinating meetings/events, taking minutes at meetings, administering contact lists, dealing with the media/spokeperson, managing funds/treasurer, chairperson (some groups rotate this role) and other general organisational skills.

If you think you might be interested in offering your skills and energies, we would be grateful if you could send a short paragraph with your name, how/where you were affected by the tsunami and suggestions of what you can offer the committee.

Planning for the First Anniversary

The Government is anxious to support those affected by the tsunami whatever they wish to do to mark this important event. They have asked for your views on whether/when there should be a formal service and/or whether people will wish to mark this privately. Autumn Events

Candle Project Groupday for Children

The Candle Project based at St Christopher's Hospice in London is offering a groupday for parents and children on Saturday October 15.

St Christopher's Hospice has been caring for the bereaved relatives of patients for nearly 40 years. The St Christopher's Candle project extends that care to all children and families bereaved by death, not just those families of patients, and has been running groupdays for bereaved children young people and families since 1998. They have a team of professionally trained staff and volunteers with a lot of experience, as they have run over 20 group events each year. Most of the families they work with have been bereaved by a sudden and unexpected death, such as an accident or sudden illness.

These groups would be specifically for people bereaved in the tsunami. The day will involve times for parents and carers and children to be separate, with young people doing activities in different groups according to age, and times to be together as a family. Many children and young people have commented after such events that the most helpful bit is being with others and realising that there are others in the same position as them. Parents and carers have also welcomed the opportunity to have some time for themselves, and to talk about the issues for their children with others who can understand and help. The aims of the day are:

- To give young people and families the chance to meet others in the same situation as themselves. Grief can be a very isolating experience.
- To help young people learn some new ways to express their feelings, and to give them and their parents or carers a chance to do so.

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- To provide families an opportunity to share and talk about memories of the people who died

Tsunami Tree Website

Tinge Krishnan, writes about the 'Tsunami Tree' website she has started:-

www.tsunamitree.com is a new website for survivors and volunteers, providing expression, support and co-ordination. It has a 'volunteers re-united' and 'survivors re-united' section so that people who worked together, helped or were helped or simply shared experiences from the tsunami can find each other. The plan is to create a similar engine to 'friends re-united'.

We are in contact with trauma counsellors and earthquake experts who are available to answer questions. The site also intends to provide some advocacy for needs of survivors etc. What do people out there want from our website? Please contact us so we can help address your needs.

We need volunteers who can translate Thai, Tamil, Singhalese, Bahasa so that the site can have a truly multi-lingual forum. We also need IT people on an ongoing basis to provide technical support and assist with expansion. If you are interested please let us know.

We are aiming also to produce a 'rough guide' to on-the-ground NGOs. This will help people identify who they can send direct aid to and will also identify reputable NGOs for people who want to volunteer. I'm sure you are all aware of the reports on the internet about volunteer scams!

National Audit Office Review

Tell us what you think -Government Departments are keen to learn lessons from survivors

The National Audit Office (NAO), an independent public sector watchdog responsible for reviewing the work of all Government departments and agencies, writes:

We make sure that not only do we provide value for money, but our strategies and work practices are refined and developed by learning from experience. We are about to begin a review of the services provided to the families and survivors affected by the Asian tsunami. The Zito Trust, a highly respected organisation with great experience in dealing with victims of sudden or violent death, will work with us to undertake the review.

Since Boxing Day 2004, many of you will have had contact with numerous Government departments and agencies – the Foreign Office, the Red Cross, the Department of Culture Media and Sport, Health Service and many others. What was the contact like? What could be done better if another large scale tragedy should strike? This is not just a paper exercise and your experiences will help the departments and agencies learn valuable lessons for the future.

The work will be based on an initial approach by letter to all UK bereaved families asking them if they would like to share their experiences with us. We will also contact a sample of survivors and others affected by the tsunami.
